



Miami-Dade County Continues to Have the Largest Net International Migration in 2024

Population increased at faster pace than nationally (1%) during July 1, 2023 to July 1, 2024 in Miami-Dade (2.3%), Broward (1.7%), Palm Beach (1.6%), and St. Lucie (3.9%), according to the latest US Census Bureau Vintage 2024 Population Estimates.

In Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach counties, international net migration drove the increase. In St. Lucie County, net domestic migration led to the increase in population. In Miami-Dade County, a higher natural increase (births less deaths) also bolstered population growth.

Miami-Dade County's population rose to 2.84 million people, an increase of 64,211 people, the second largest numeric increase among 3,114 counties. Miami-Dade County's population rose 2.3%, outpacing the national population growth by 1.0%.

Miami-Dade County's net international migration at 123,835 drove the growth in population, the highest in the nation (also 1st in 2023). Broward County had the 5th largest net international migration in the nation at 56,567 (also 5th in 2023). Palm Beach County had the 13th largest net international migration at 32,825 (also 13th in 2023). Martin County also posted a net international migration (1,183) as well as St. Lucie (3,223).

The net international migration offset the net domestic outmigration in Miami-Dade (-67,418), Broward (-26,339), and Palm Beach (-7,546). It also offset the natural decrease in population (more deaths than births) in Martin County (-979) and St. Lucie County (-367).

In St. Lucie County, net domestic migration drove the increase in population. Its domestic migration of 11,645 people was the 13th largest of 1,601 counties that had positive domestic migration (51% of 3,144 counties). In the state of Florida, St. Lucie was 6th out of 55 counties with a positive net domestic migration (82% of 67 counties).

On average, a net of 155 people moved to Miami-Dade County per day, the second highest in the nation; in Broward County, 83 people/day; in Palm Beach, 69 people/day; in St. Lucie, 41 people/day; and in Martin, 7 people/day.

Miami-Dade and Broward also had a natural increase in population due to a younger population structure (median age of 41 years in Miami-Dade and 41.5 years in Broward) compared to an older population structure in Martin (median age of 53.4 years), Palm Beach (median age of 45.6 years) and St. Lucie (median age of 45.2 years) where there was a decrease in population due to natural change (more deaths than births).

The 2024 International Homebuyer Transactions of MIAMI Realtors® reported that Florida is the top destination of foreign buyers, accounting for 20% of all foreign buyers nationally. The Miami-Fort Lauderdale-West Palm Beach metro area accounts for 49% of Florida's foreign buyer market, with buyers coming from 49 countries, led by Argentina, Colombia, Canada, Brazil, Mexico, and Venezuela. Foreign buyers accounted for 10% of Southeast Florida's market compared to 2% nationally. [Foreign Buyers & Market Update - MIAMI REALTORS®](#).

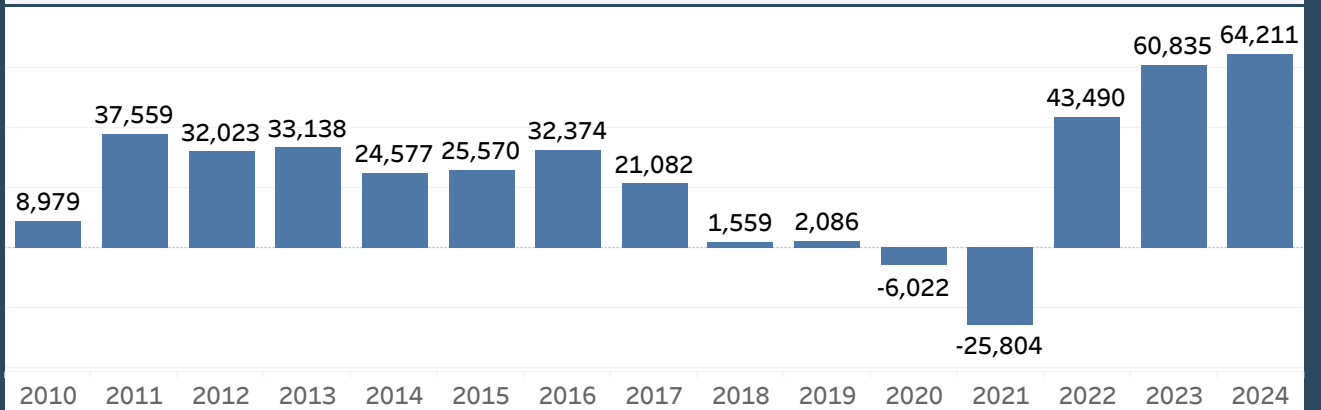

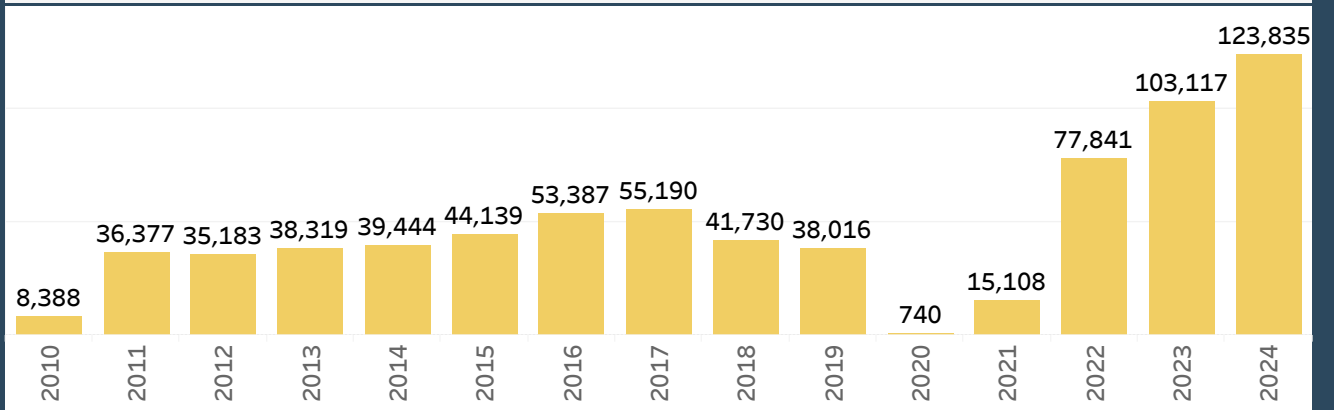

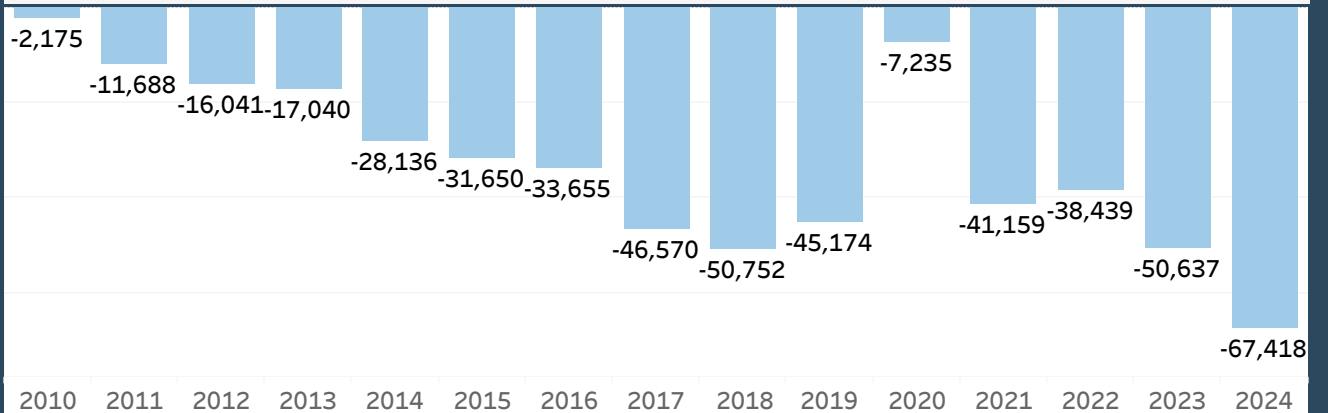
Net Population Change in Miami-Dade County



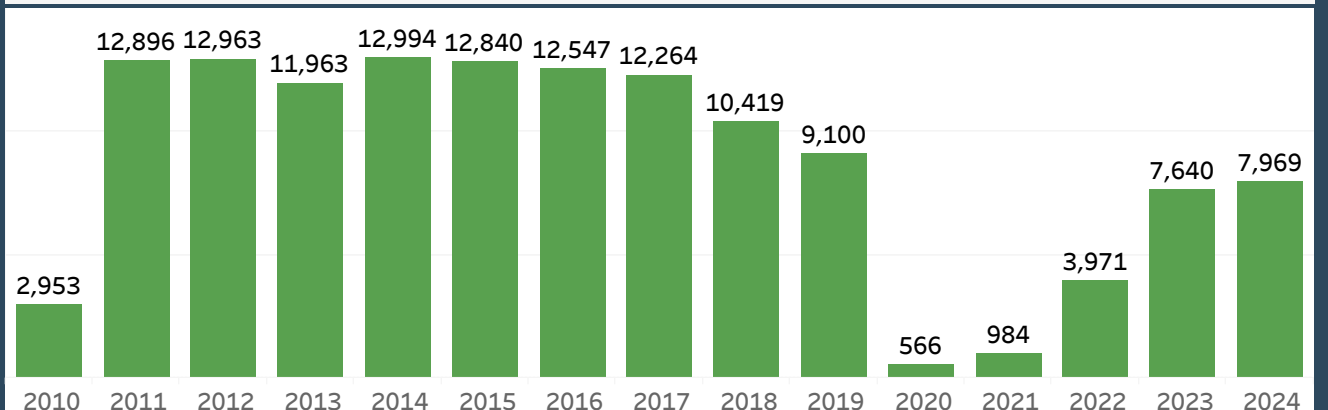
International Migration in Miami-Dade County

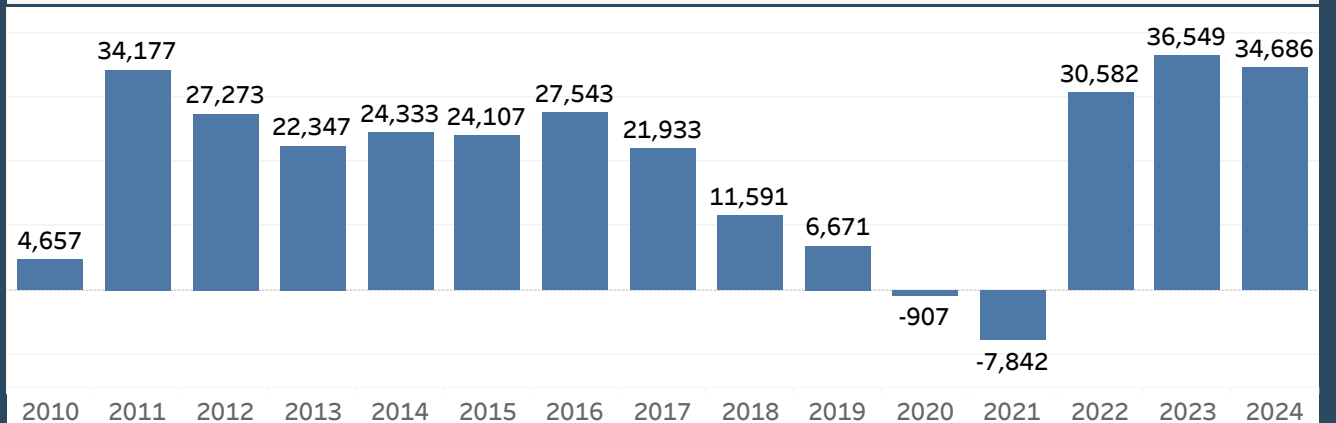

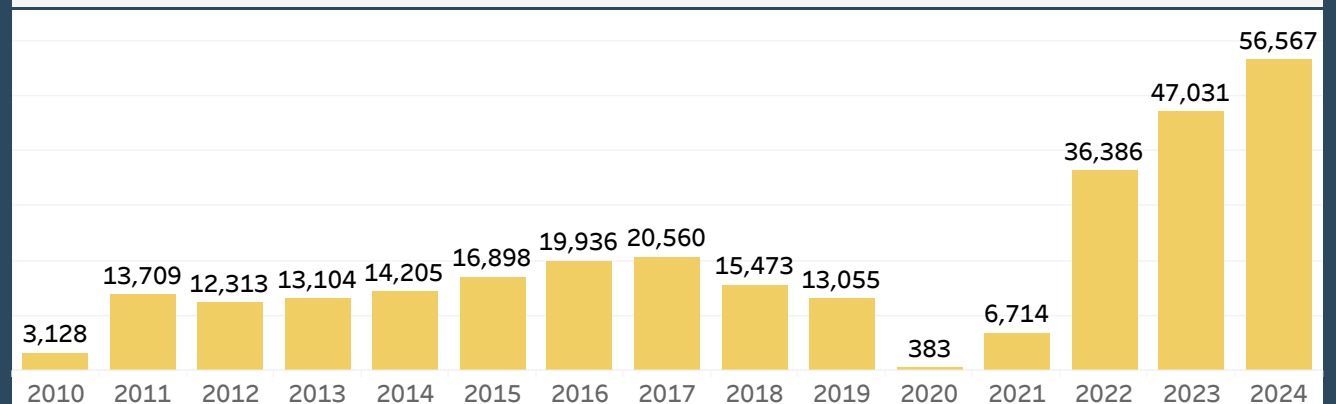

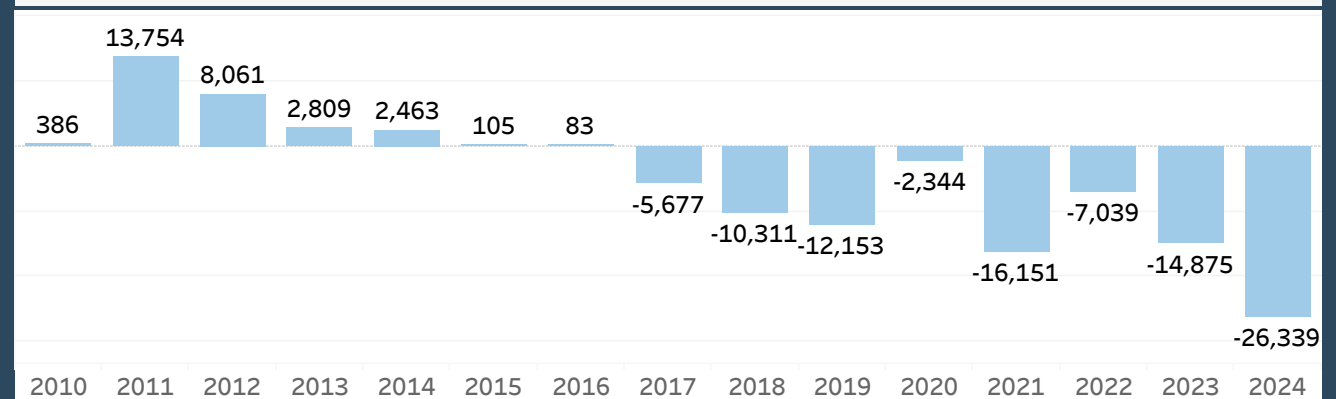
Net Population Change in Broward County



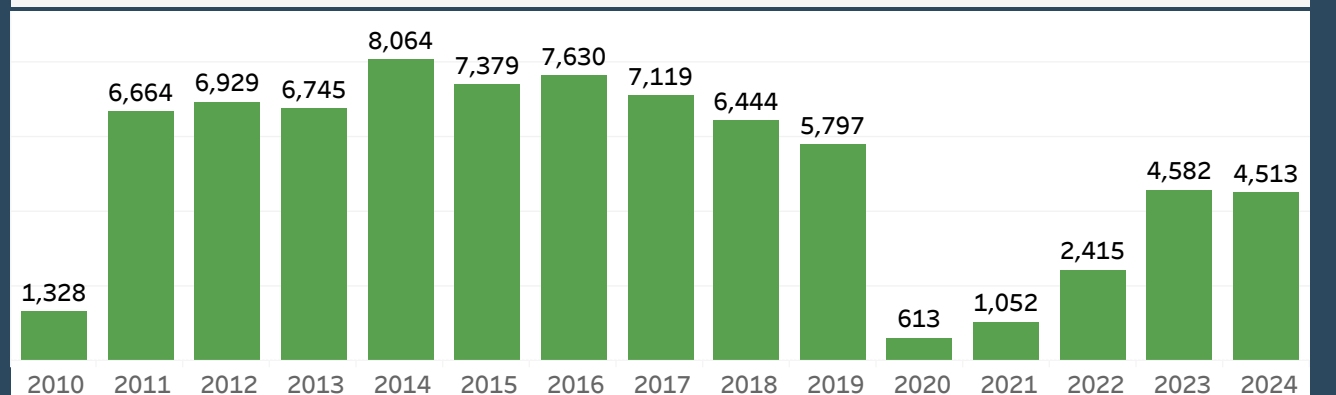
International Migration in Broward County

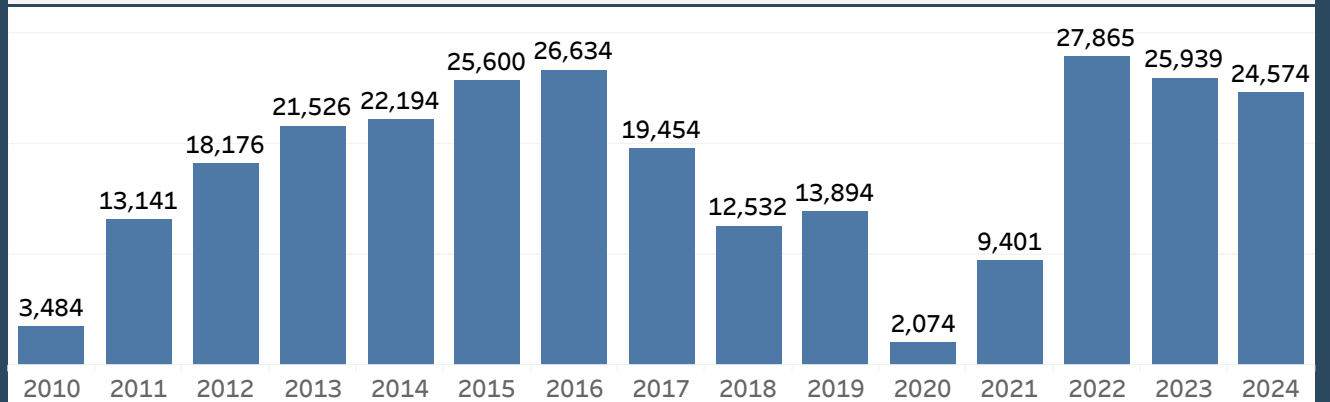

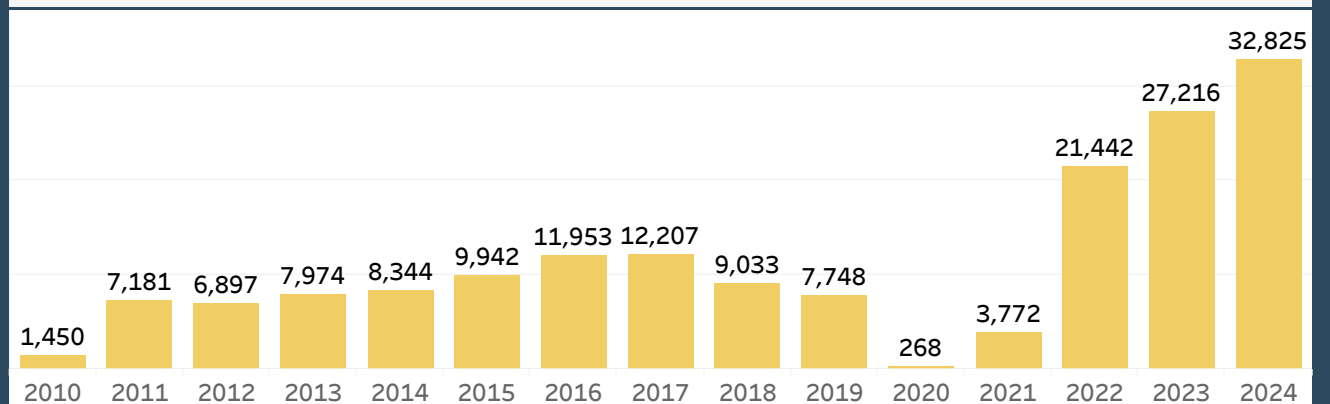

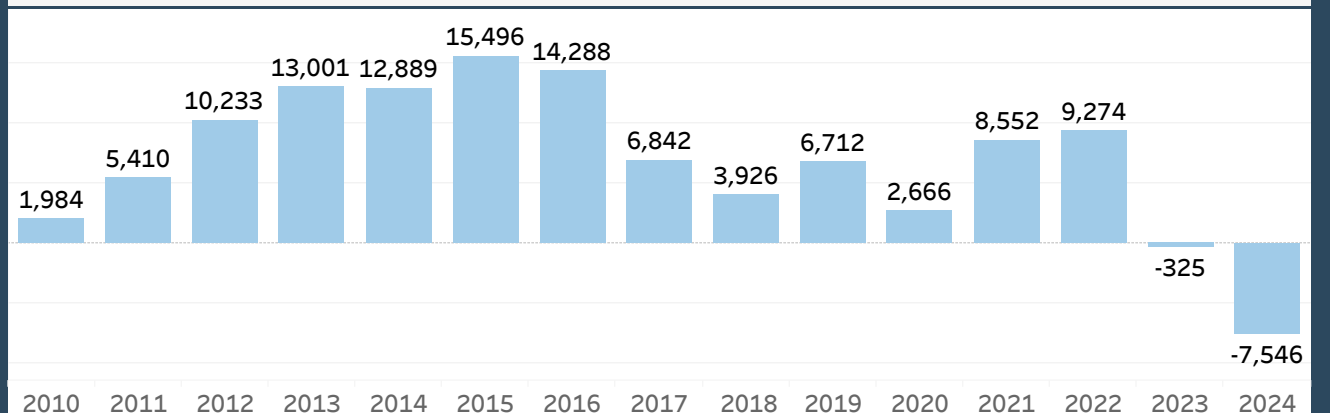
Net Population Change in Palm Beach County



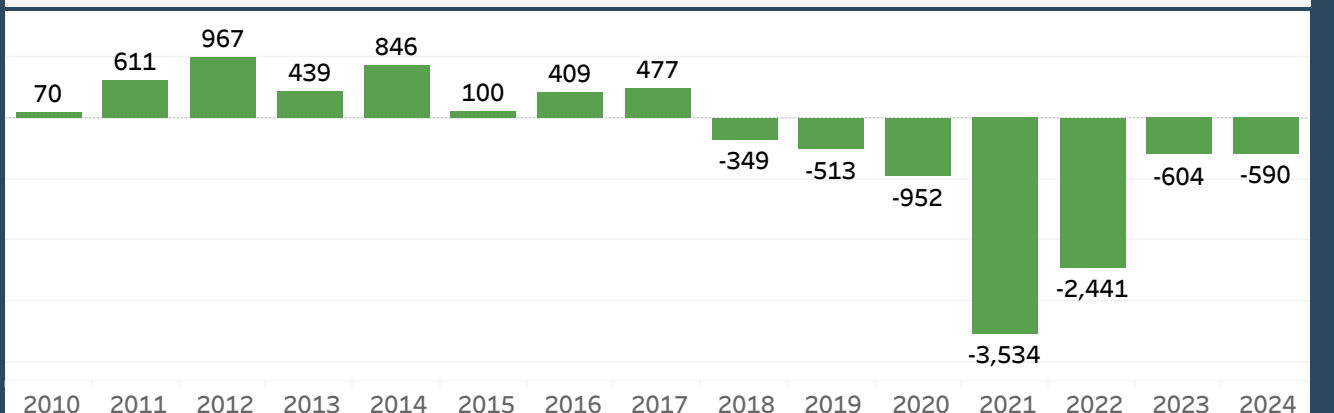
International Migration in Palm Beach County

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Martin County Population Trends, 2010-2024

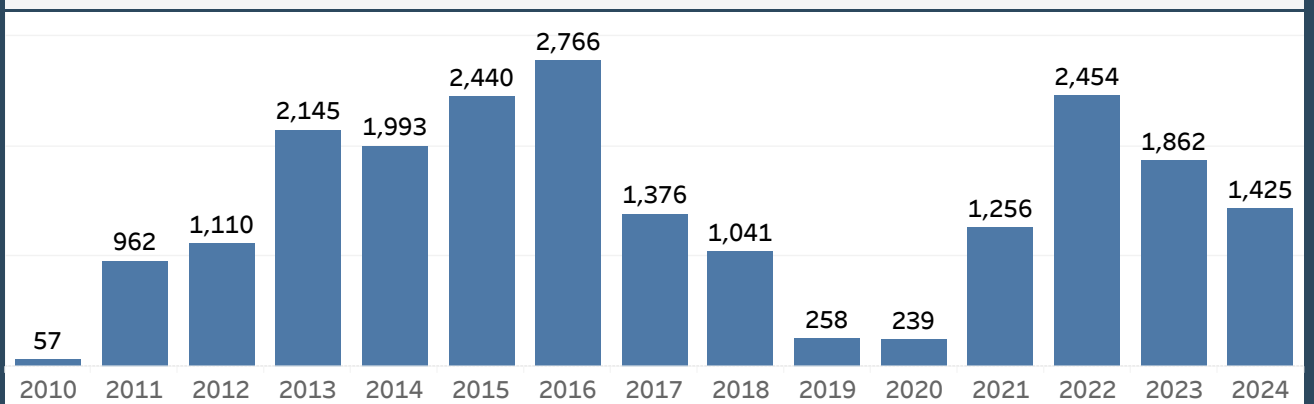

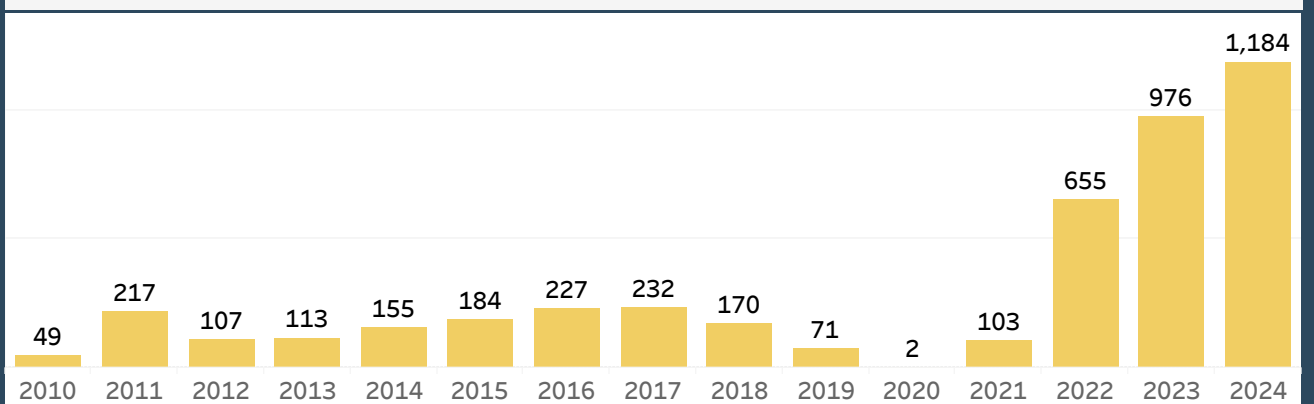

Higher Natural Decrease in Population

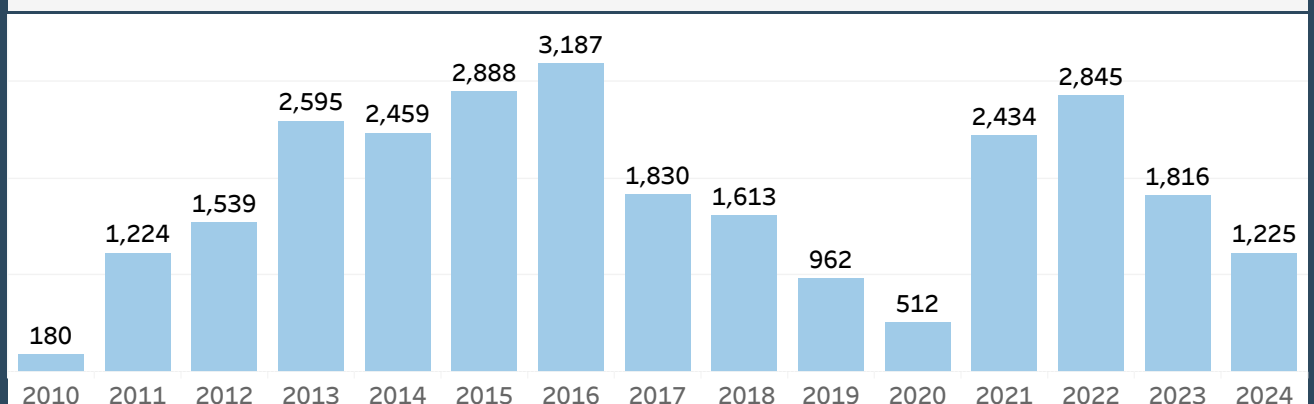
Net Population Change in Martin County



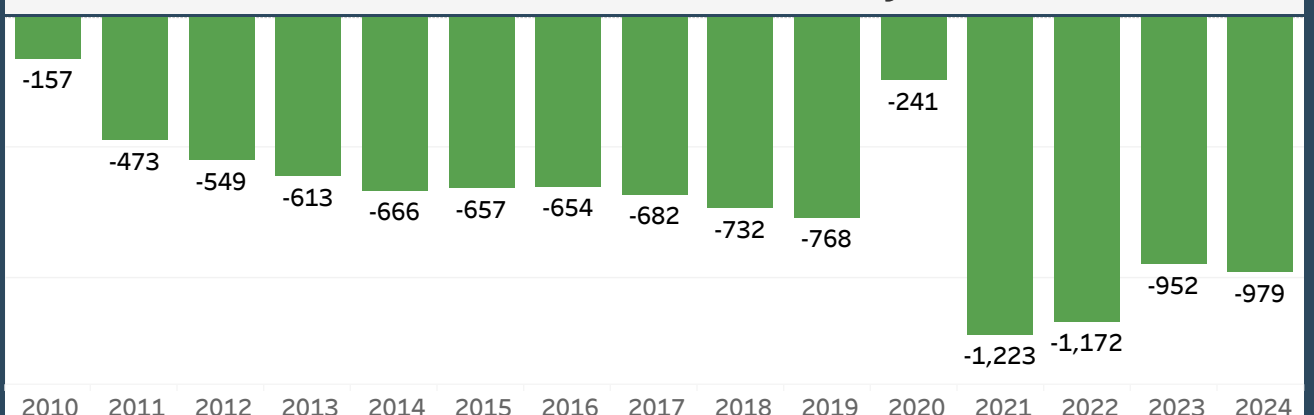
International Migration in Martin County

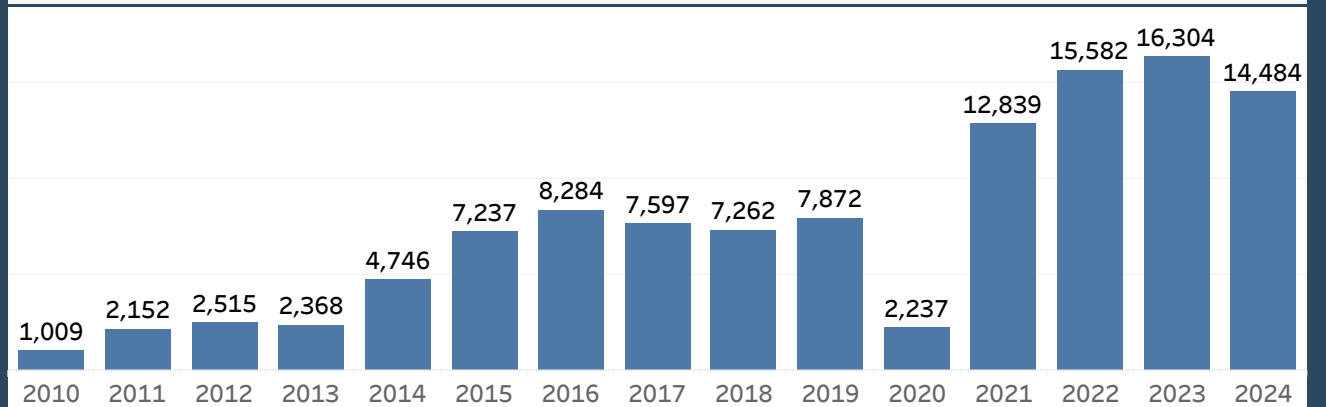

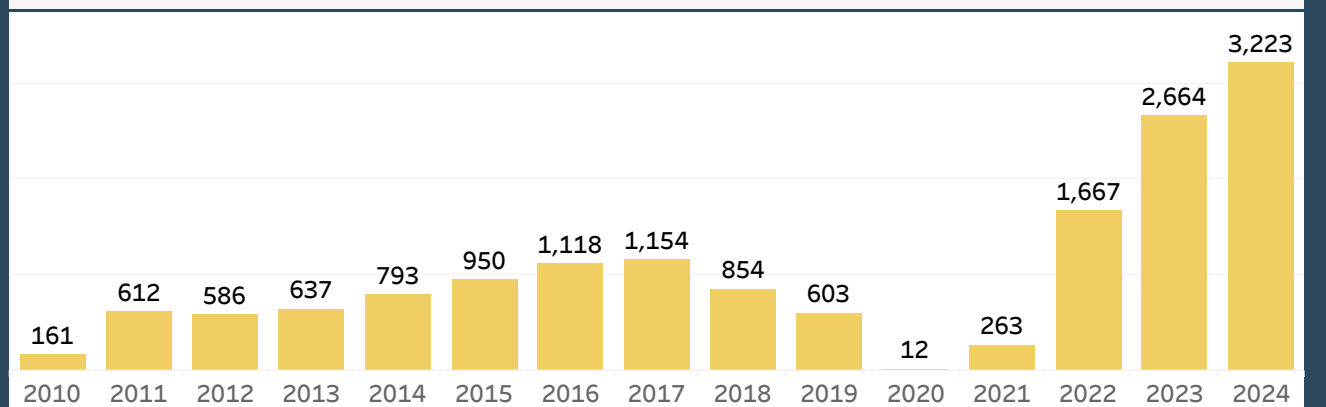

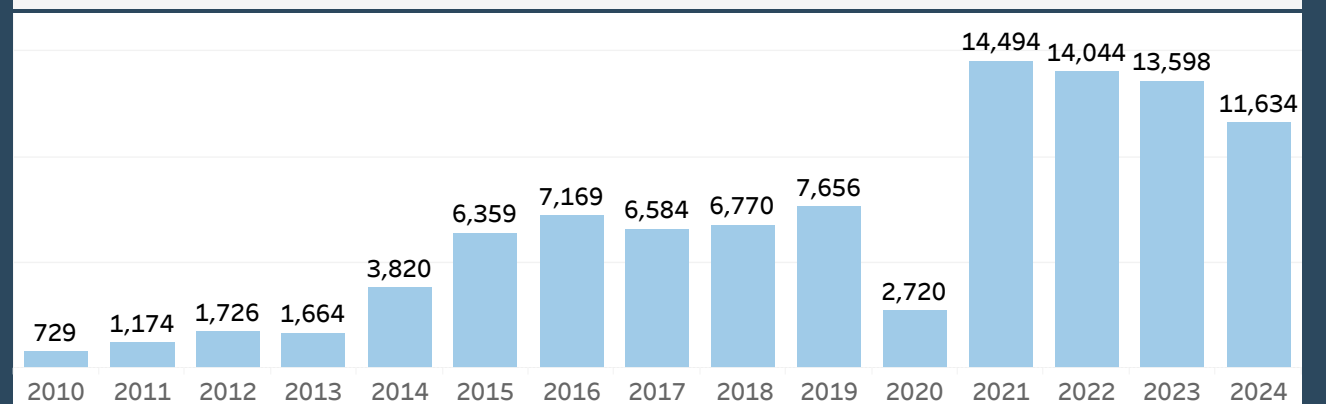
Net Population Change in St. Lucie County



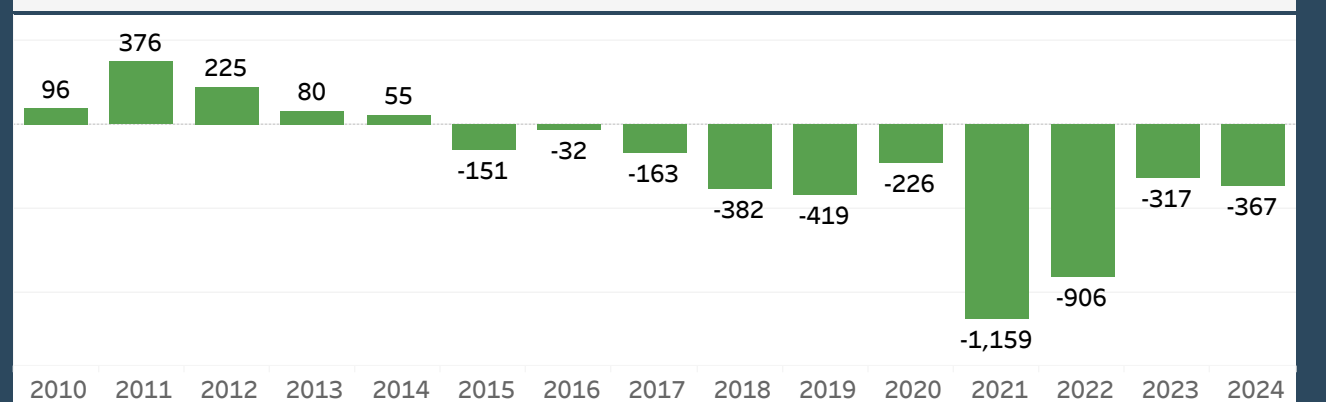
International Migration in St. Lucie County
