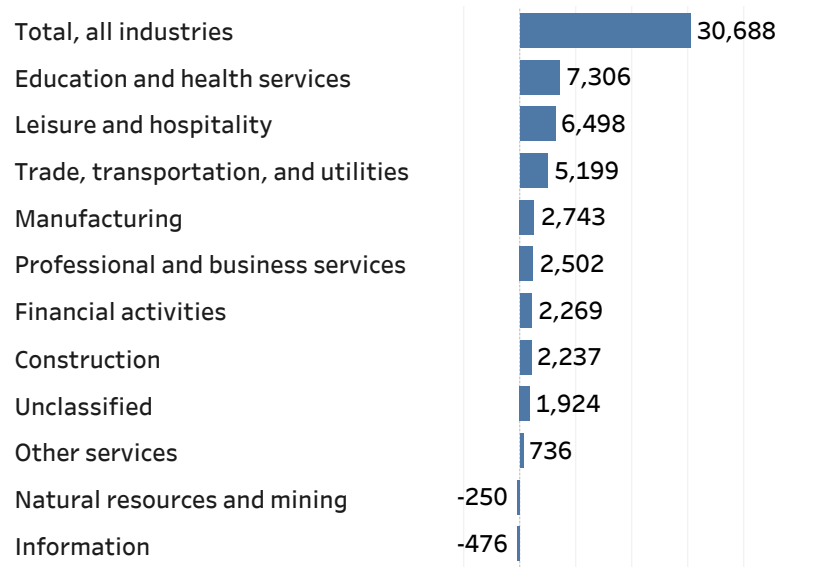
## Employment & Wage Trends Report

### Key Takeaways

- 1. Total employment (including self-employed) rose at an annual rate of 3.1% compared to 0.6% nationally and 2% one year ago.
- 2. Miami-Dade County had the 4th largest payroll employment gains among 3,141 counties (33,731).
- 3. The education/health industry had the largest employment gain, but the information industry lost jobs.
- 4. Workers in the information and financial activities industries earned the highest wages on average at about \$110,000 to \$130,000 annually.

#### Y/Y Change in Private Employment, Sept 2023

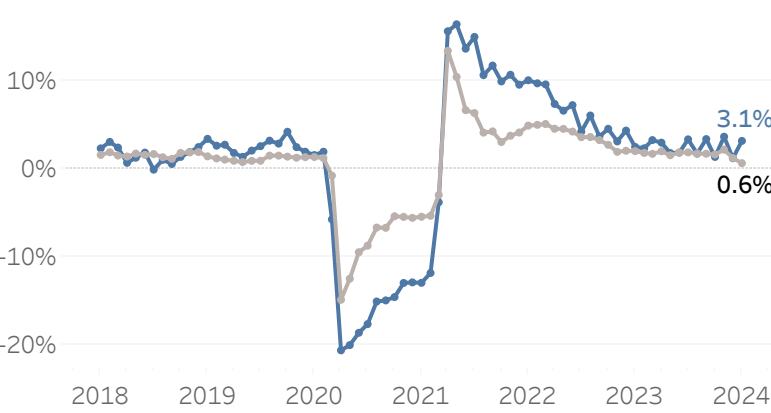

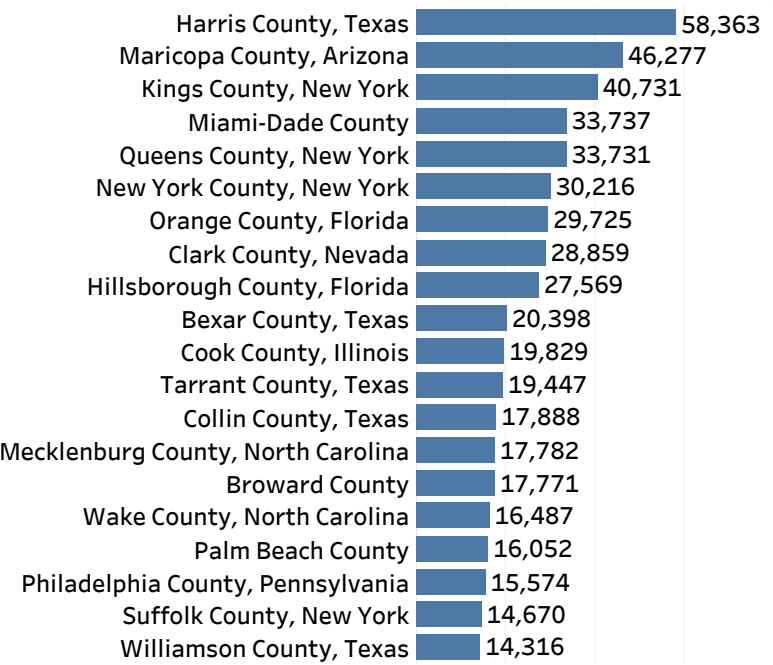

#### Y/Y Percent Change in Total Employment, Jan 2024



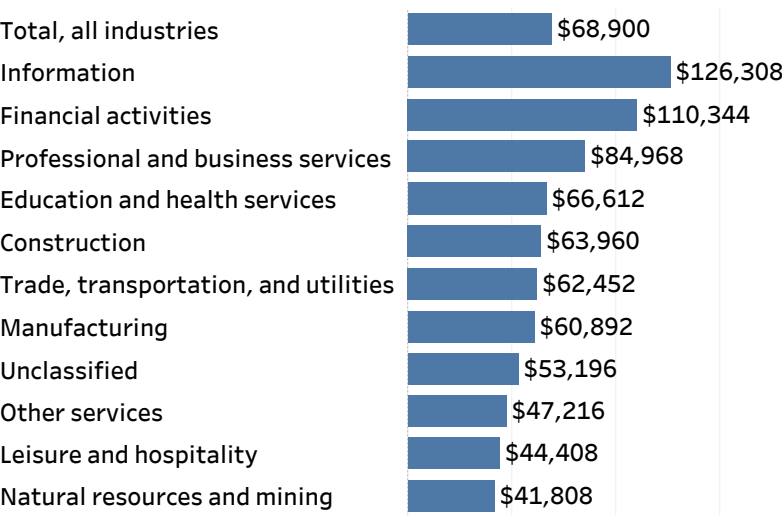
### Largest Y/Y Payroll Employment Gains, Sept 2023

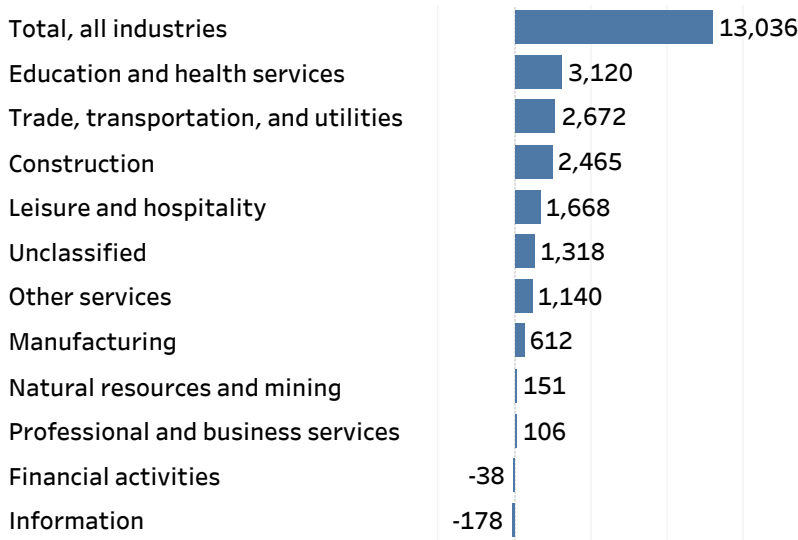

- 3. The education/health industry had the largest employment gain, but the finance/real estate and information industries lost jobs.
- 4. Workers in the information industry earned the highest wages on average at about \$115,000 annually.

#### Y/Y Change in Private Employment, Sept 2023

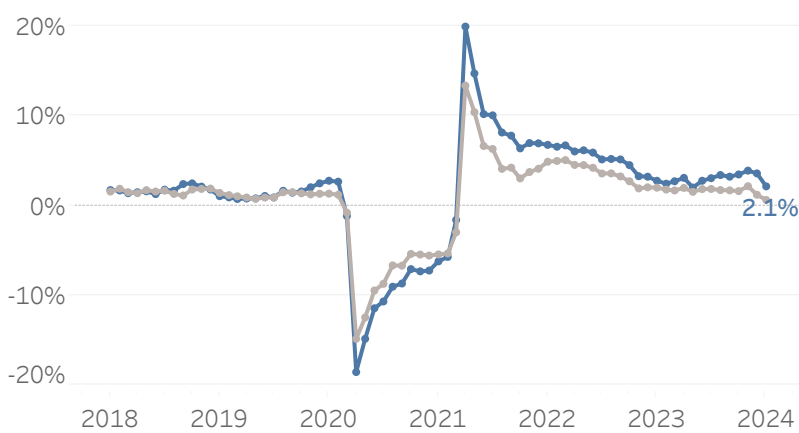

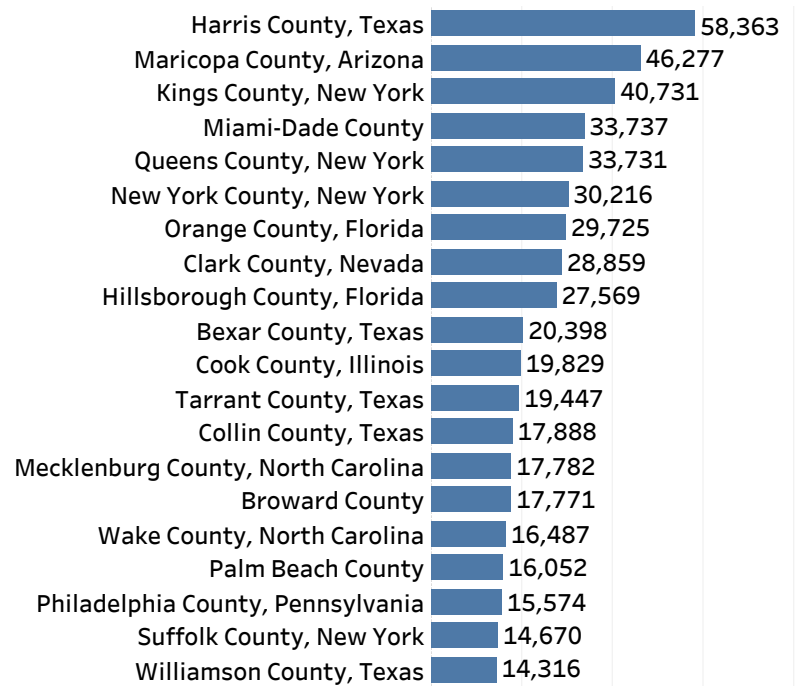

#### Y/Y Percent Change in Total Employment, Jan 2024

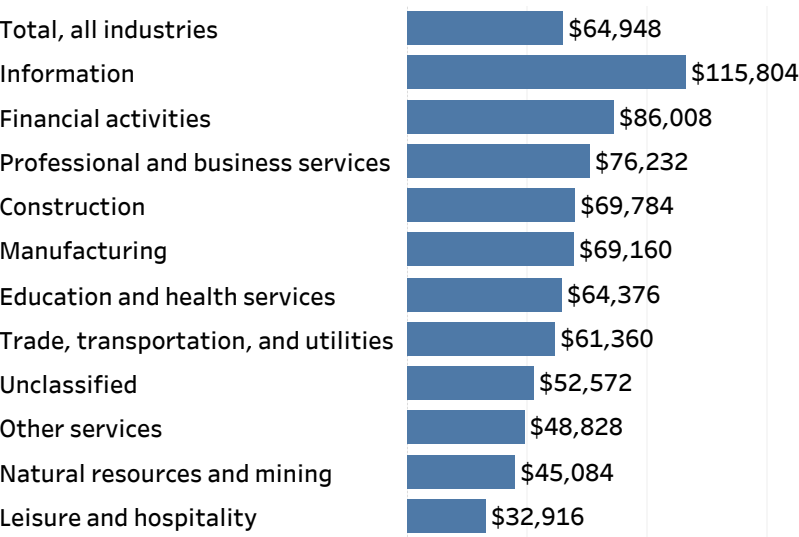


#### Largest Y/Y Payroll Employment Gains, Sept 2023

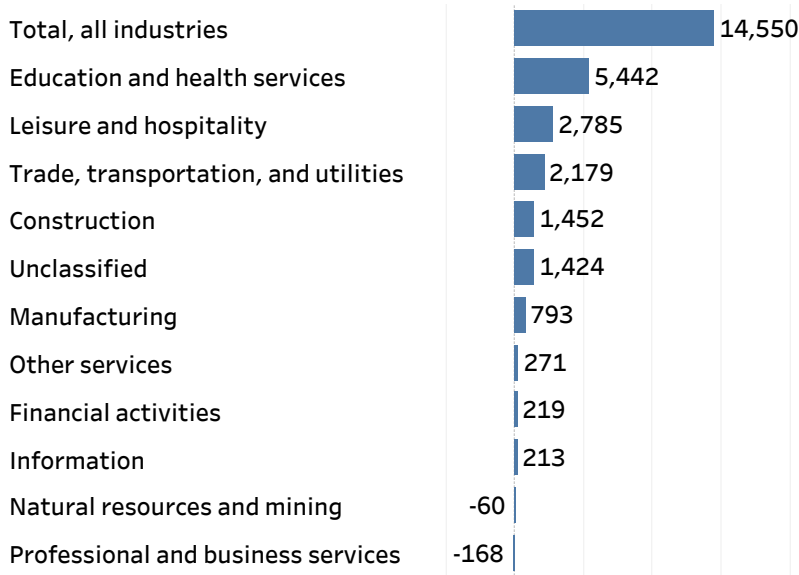

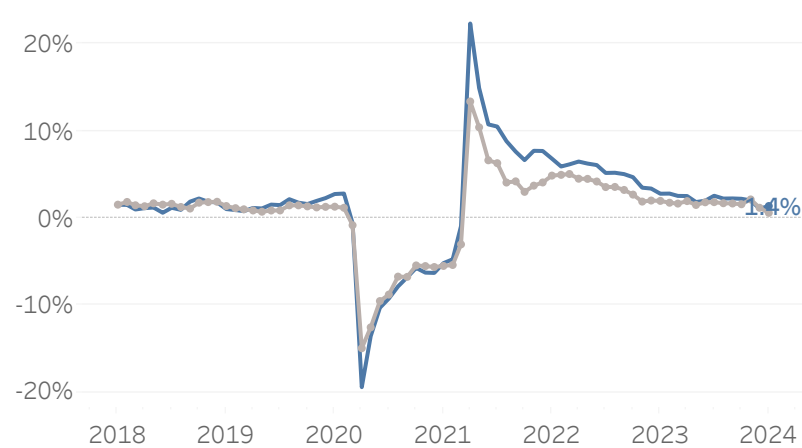

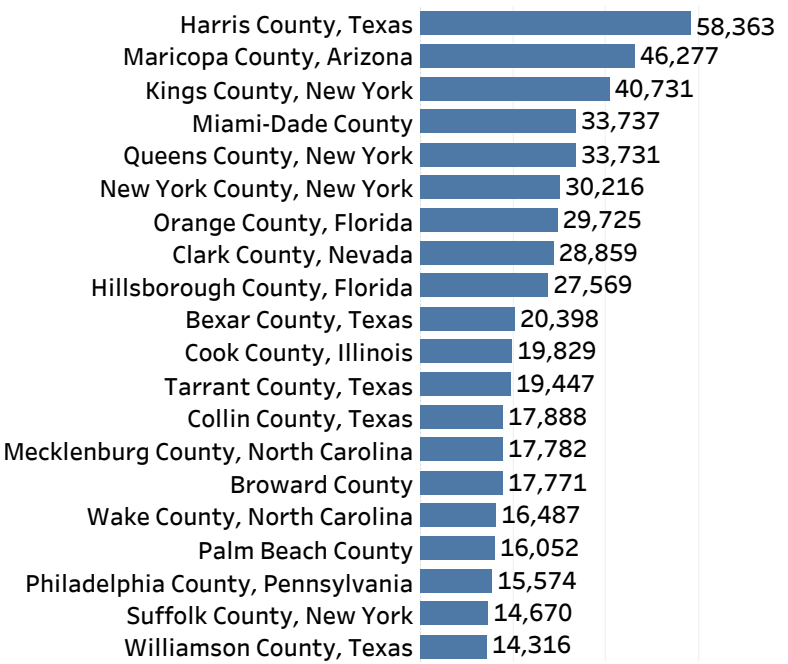

#### Y/Y Percent Change in Total Employment, Jan 2024

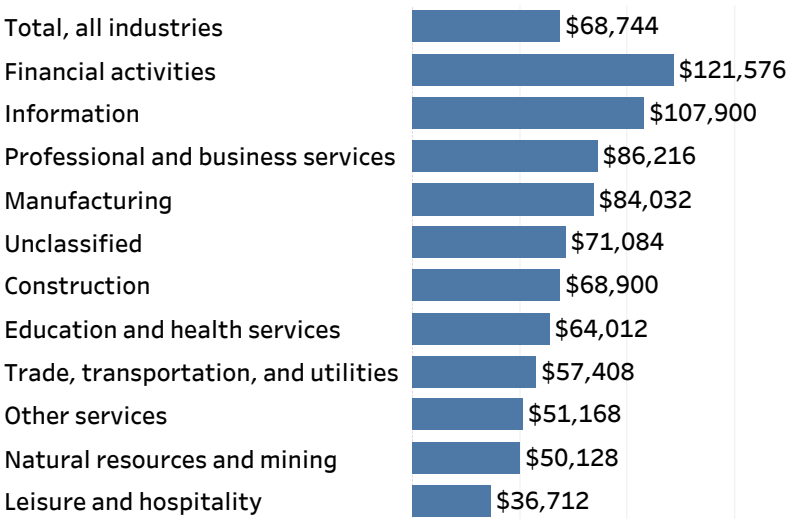


#### Largest Y/Y Payroll Employment Gains, Sept 2023

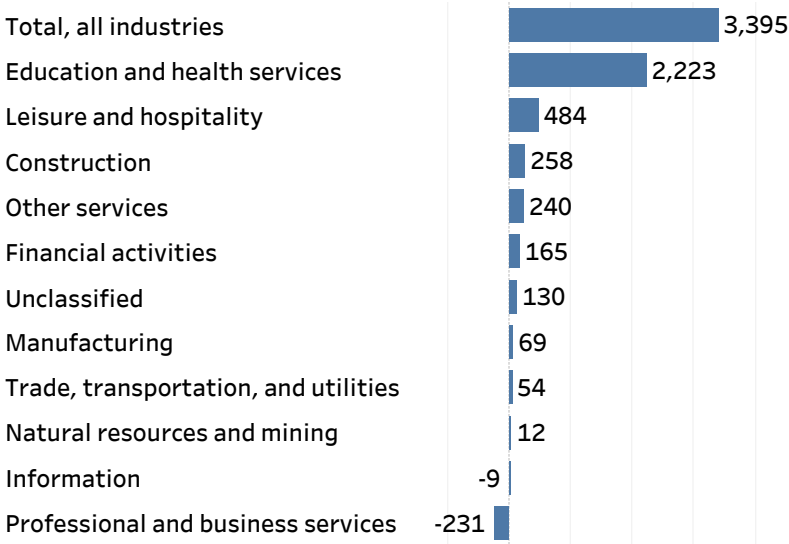

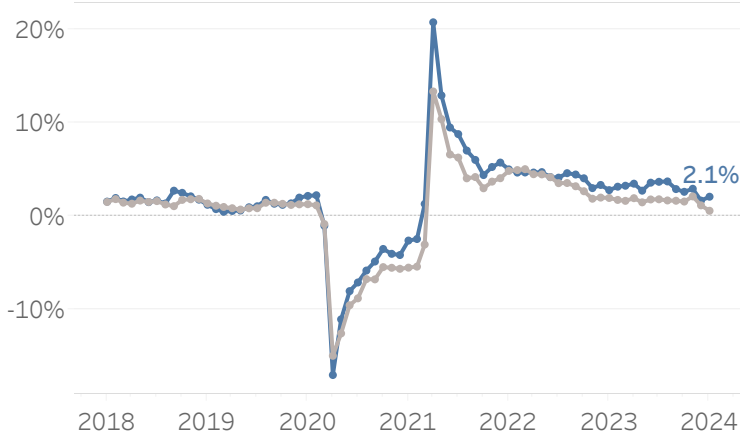

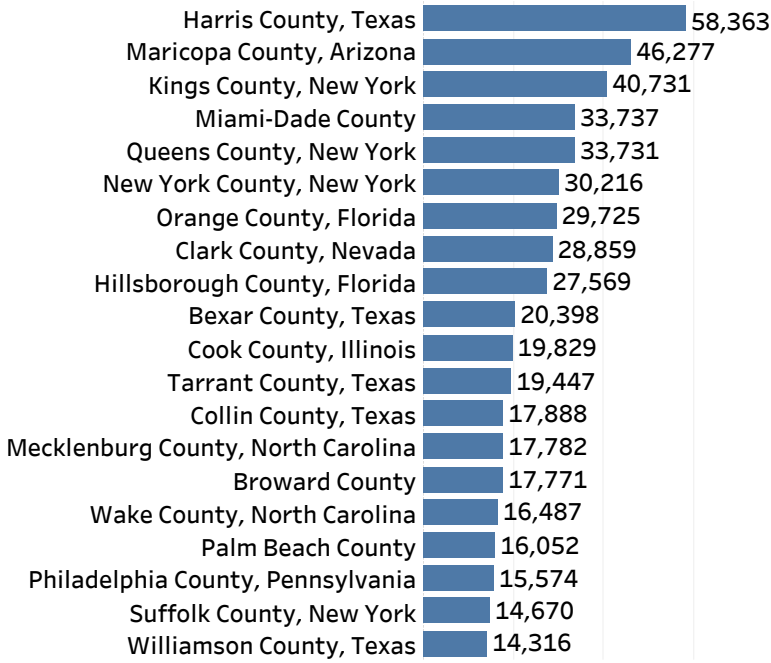

Y/Y Percent Change in Total Employment, Jan 2024

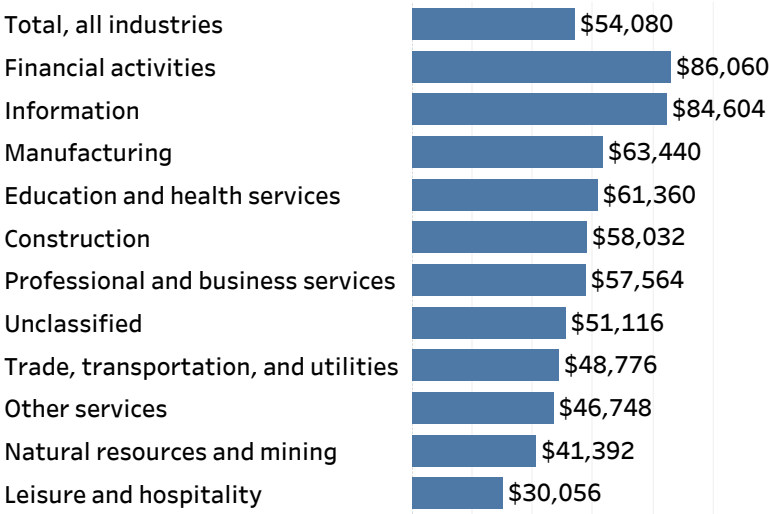


Largest Y/Y Payroll Employment Gains, Sept 2023

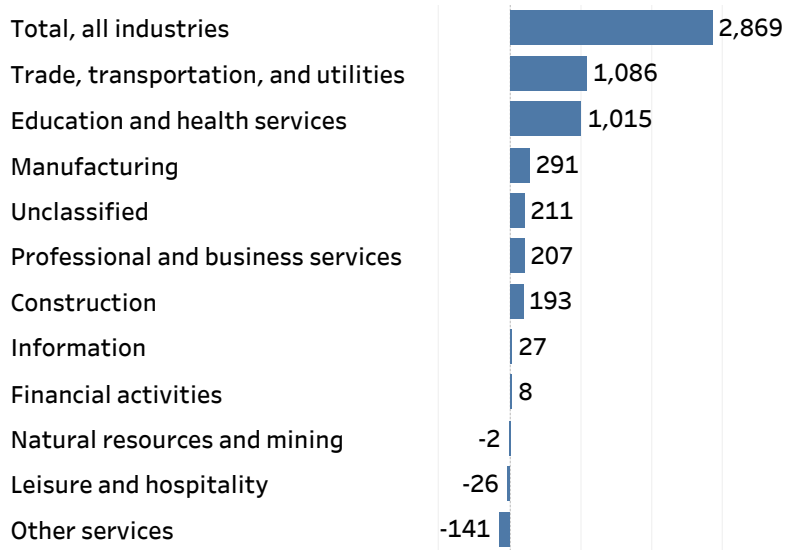

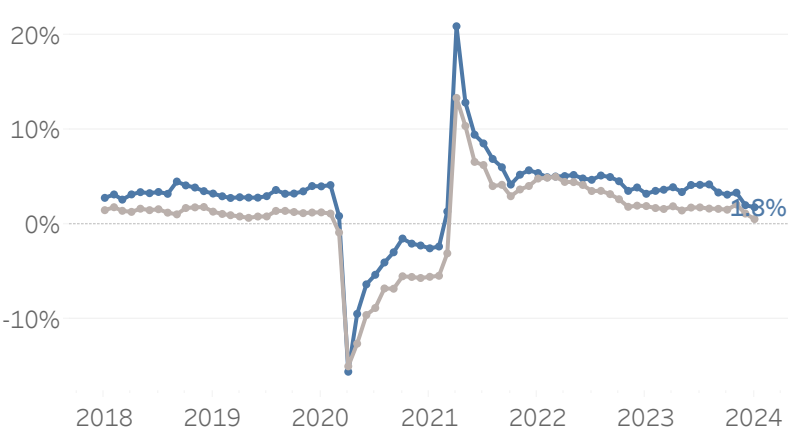

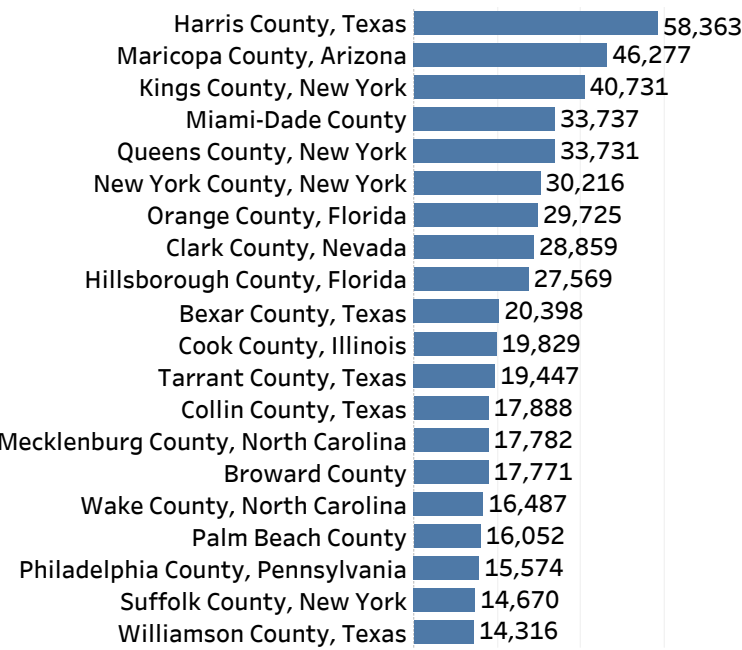
